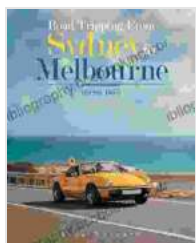

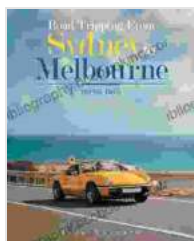
Then, continue driving east towards Melbourne. This drive takes approximately 2 hours.
